



GUEST HOUSE

This one story L-shaped building has a low-pitched gable roof that extends within the L to form an arcade for entering the various rooms. At one side of the building is a decorative Romanesque brick and stone arch. The building, used as a guest and recreation rooms, is covered with board and batten siding. It was designed by architect Berkeley Brandt in the 1930s.
